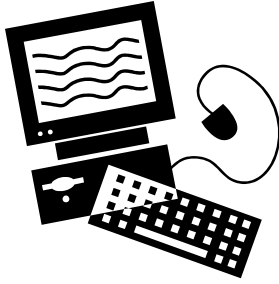
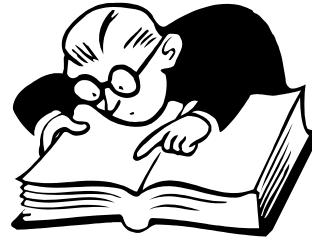


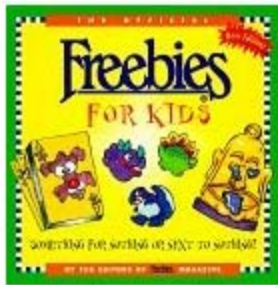
RESOURCE BOOKS FOR TEACHERS AND VOLUNTEERS

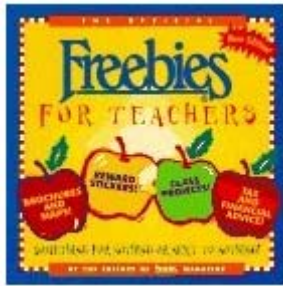
The Official Freebies for Kids: Something for Nothing or Next to Nothing! (5th ed.)

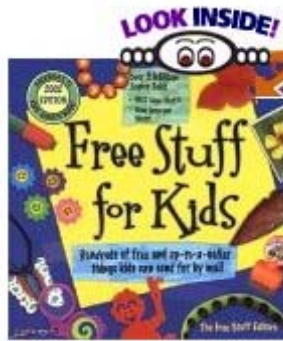

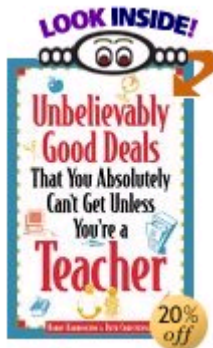
Free Stuff for Kids on the Net (Cool Sites)

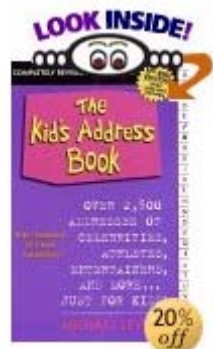
Unbelievably Good Deals That You Absolutely Can't Get Unless You're a Teacher

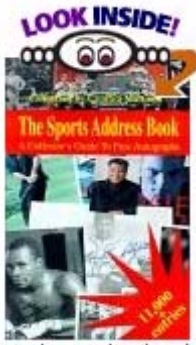
